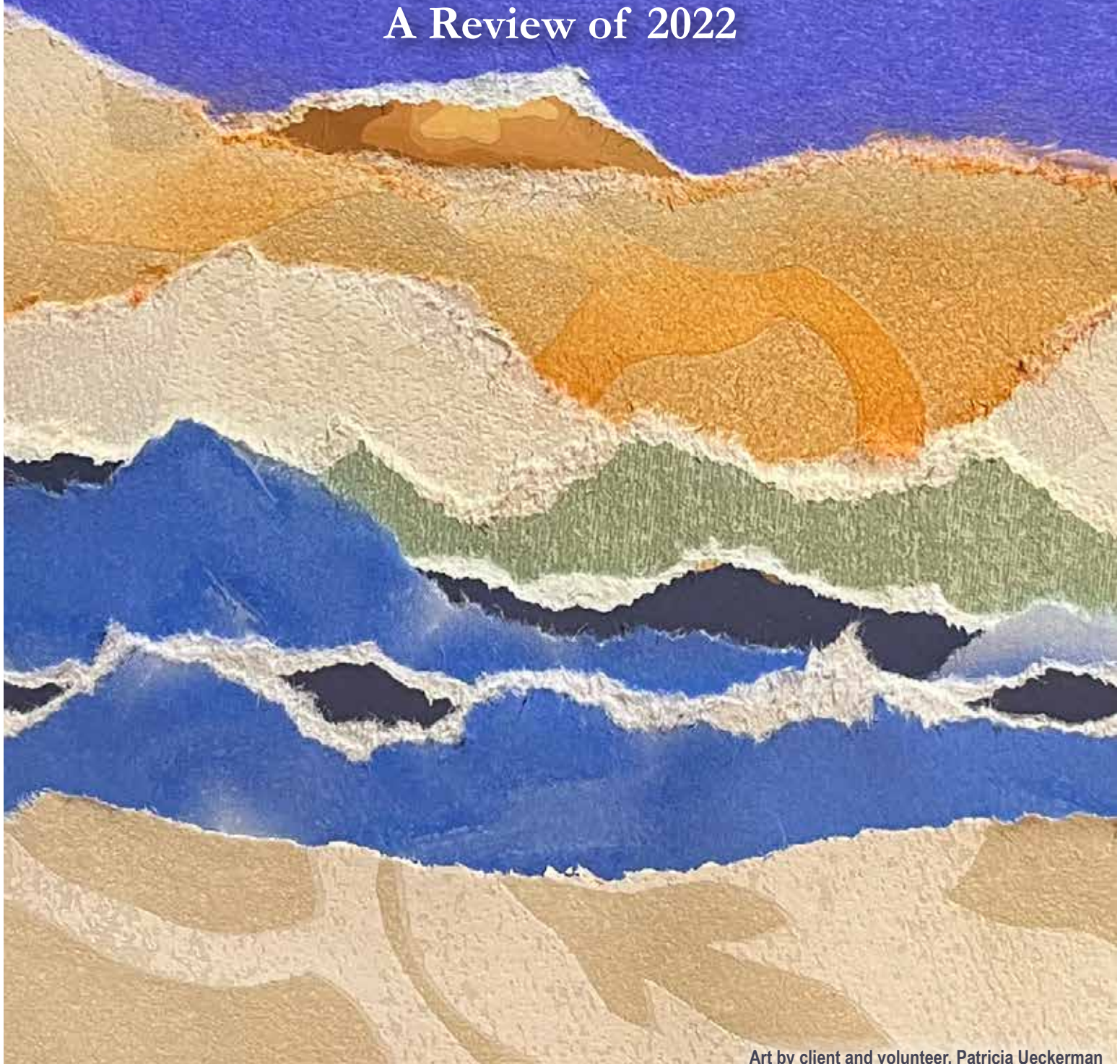
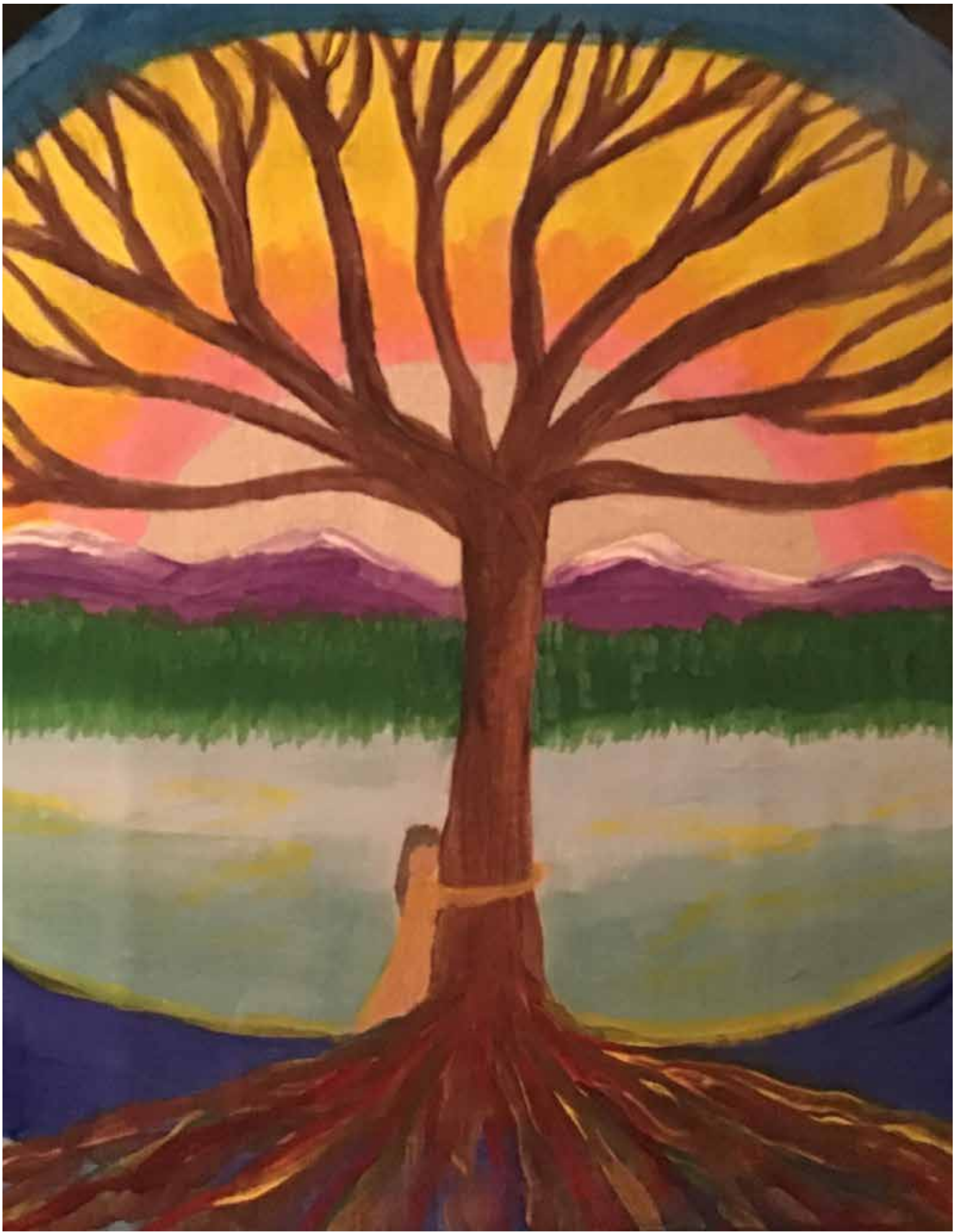

For Ann's Place, 2022 was a challenging year but it was also one of great joy and success. The flood destruction of almost two thirds of our building (over half a million dollars in damages) and the lingering pandemic could have ruined the year, but that is not what happened.

Thanks to your support, our staff and volunteers found innovative ways to carry out programs that were so successful, we will continue them even now when our building is fully open.

Two weeks after our flood, our Fashion Show attendees raised over \$35,000 for expenses not covered by the insurance and then other donors joined in throughout the year. You allowed us to dream of building back our facility in new ways. We created a Wig Salon, enhanced air systems, and built in new technology to reach clients further away or who are not feeling well. None of this would have happened without the help of this amazing community.

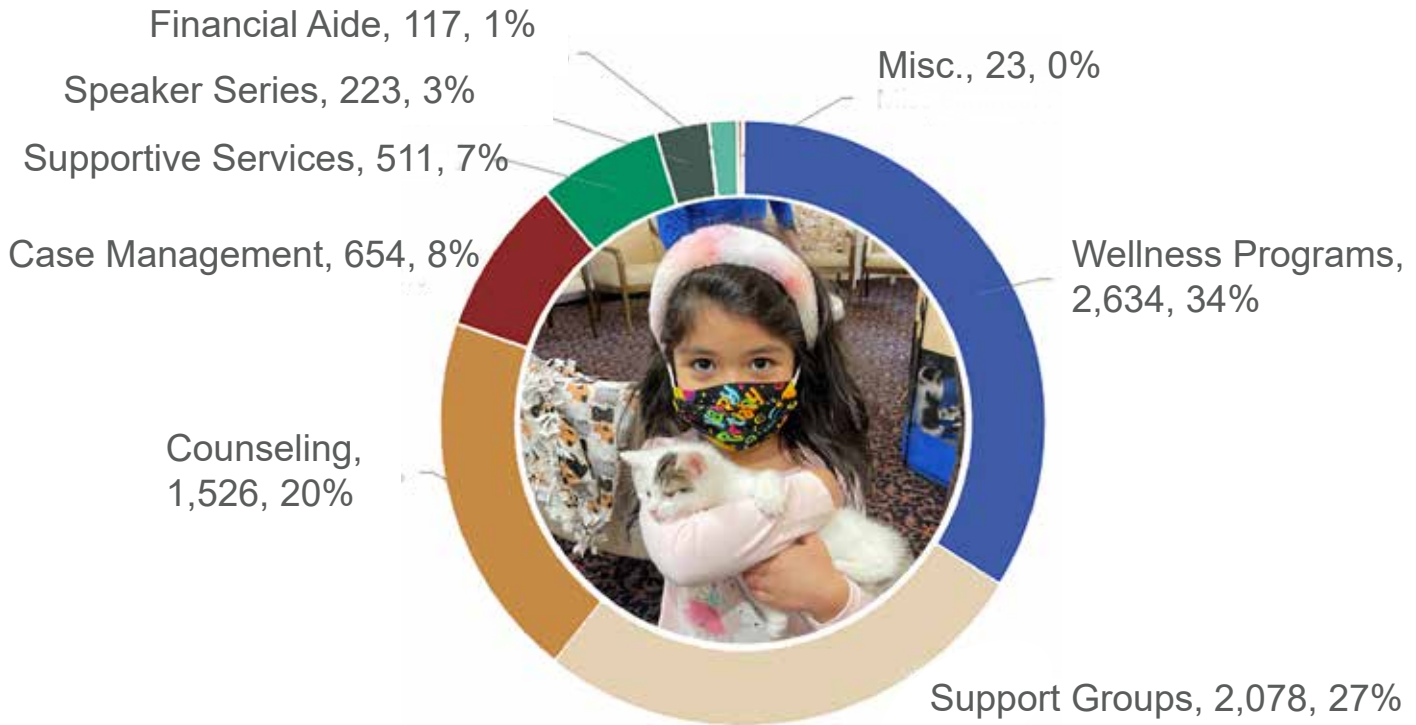

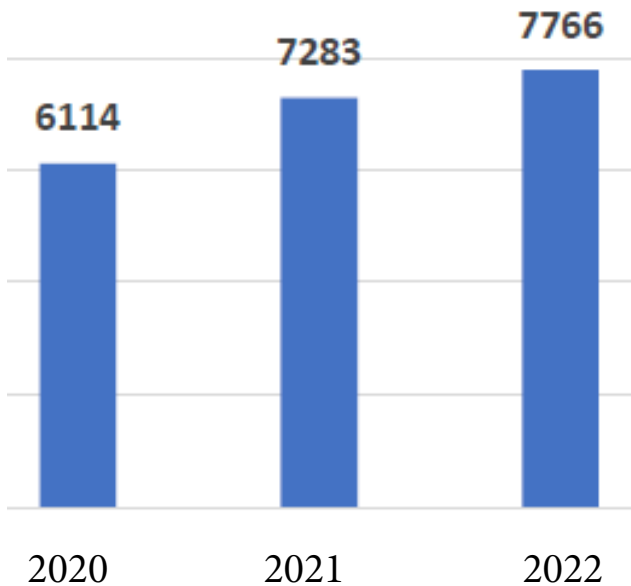

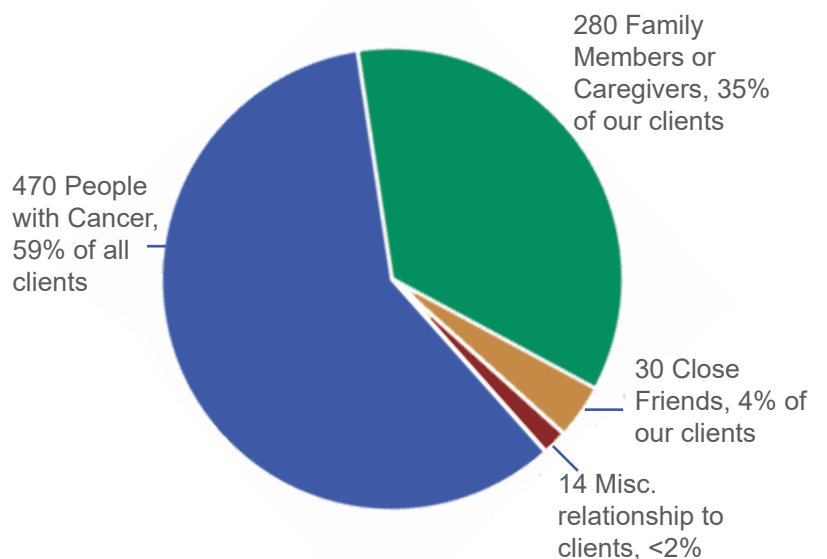
The Breakdown of Services Our Clients Needed

Our Services



Over 18 Facilitated Support Groups & Counseling

In 2022 we ran 18 support groups (15 in English and 3 in Spanish), each led by clinical facilitators. Some groups are for the person with cancer and some are for their caregivers and children. There were groups that met in-person, online and hybrid. We also provided over 1,500 one-on-one counseling sessions for those who needed extra care.

New “Salon” for Wig Fittings

As part of our Capital Campaign, we were able to install a beautiful place for women to try on wigs with a counselor. Through the years, we have concluded that it is very important to have a trained counselor at the wig fitting to address the tears that often flow as each woman grapples with this very difficult stage in her treatment.



Providing Care All The Way to End-of-Life

We are serving more families through end-of-life than in the past now that our clients can take us with them to hospitals and hospice on their phones and computers.

As a result, families can more easily receive support from Ann’s Place through this difficult time. We have also seen an increase in the need for bereavement support, so we have added programs such as Grief Yoga and our Motherless Daughters Support Group.

Offering online counseling and support groups means we can serve people even when they are bedridden.

Still Offered Free of Charge

Mind-Body Wellness and Creative Programs

Ann's Place offers many forms of movement, social, educational, and creative programs. Popular programs include horticulture therapy, yoga, kitten therapy, guitar lessons, Tai Chi, Zumba, Reiki, meditation, art, dance, music, writing workshop, nutrition, and more.

We were thrilled to welcome an Art Therapist to the team in 2022. Sometimes art allows us to express our emotions in different ways which can help reduce stress, depression and anxiety.

Supporting Struggling Families

Our Health Equity Initiative exists to provide additional services for those who might be considered underserved due to financial instability, language, cultural differences, and/or lack of health insurance. In 2022, 39% of our clients were considered underserved, an 85% increase over 2021. In addition to instability caused by the pandemic, the increase is due, in part, to staff taking a deeper dive into the welfare and status of our clients to gather more information. This has provided us with a clearer picture of their barriers to health services once a cancer diagnosis is added to our client's lives and allowed us to provide better supports for their unique challenges.



We offer an array of support groups, counseling and wellness options in Spanish. We meet clients with limited transportation in downtown Danbury where public transportation is available and provide travel reimbursement for clients coming to Ann's Place for our services. We also helped over a hundred families pay for basic needs such as rent, electric, gas and food. Over \$62,000 was distributed to pay bills for local families.

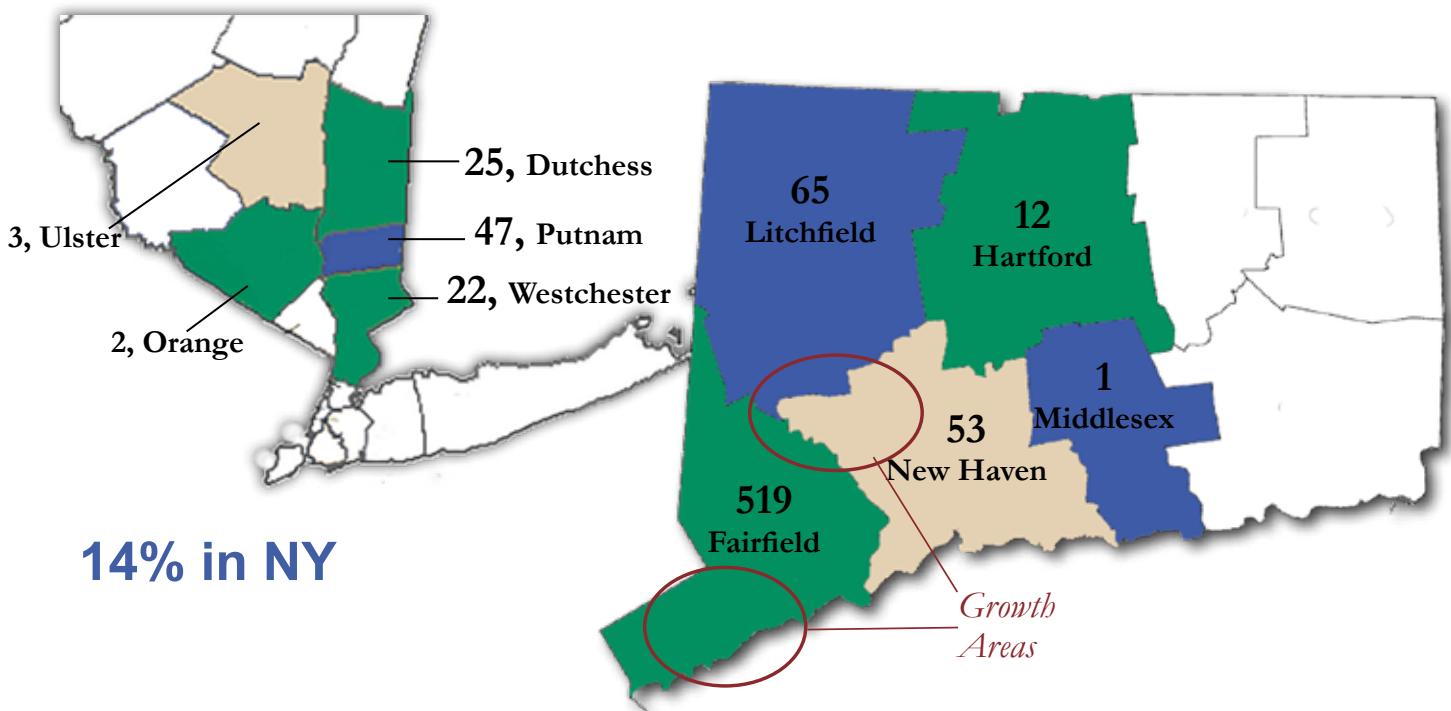

Where Have Clients Needed Us?

In 2022, we served clients living even further out from our main offices than in prior years because our programs are conveniently offered online and in-person. What we have discovered, are huge areas of CT and NY that have little to no support for families facing cancer. Currently, our fastest growth areas are the Greater Waterbury area and Southern Fairfield County.

In Fall of 2023, we will launch advisory councils for each of these areas with the goal of building up local volunteers, donors and programs to surround these clients with support. We would like to eventually be able to offer in-person services in high-need areas. With the help of each community we will make sure nobody has to confront cancer isolated and alone.

In Loving Memory of Ron Olsen (1945-2022)

After Ron's wife, Ann Olsen, passed away due to cancer in the late 80's, Ron began raising funds for families who needed financial help while a loved one was going through cancer treatment. With friends and family, he created the Ann Olsen Endowment, the namesake of Ann's Place. The endowment later merged with the nonprofit / *Can*, which provided counseling and support groups, and together, was later named "Ann's Place". Ron was an active volunteer and donor for over three decades. He always had a kind word to share and gave a tremendous amount to others. We will miss him, but his legacy will live on at Ann's Place for a very long time.

We were thrilled to bring back all four of our main in-person fundraising events in 2022. These events, combined with community fundraisers contributed 46% of the total cash revenue.

Due to our flood, we also ran a Capital Campaign to cover the costs of our building renovations not covered by insurance. \$238,769 was raised for capital improvements. Expenses for several of the projects will occur in 2023 due to timing of the construction.

Contributed Services represents the value of the pro-bono staff time. Our pro-bono staff had a 14% increase in donated professional services over 2021. Services included things such as yoga, art therapy, writing workshops, facilitating support groups, horticulture therapy and other great programs.

In-Kind Contributions include the donated goods provided to our fundraising events, such as the decorated trees for Festival of Trees and event raffle prizes.

We are so grateful to all of the donors who contributed in-kind, professional or cash gifts so that we could support our families facing cancer.
